

The article states: "Any member in good standing who submits a written request to schedule an appointment to review a copy of the minutes or the log of motions may do so." This allows members to draw their own conclusion on the entire meeting, not just highlights that someone else considered important to print. Although he started his career at non-union set shops and moved on, he has expressed his tremendous desire to exercise those previous relationships in an effort to reach out back into the world and bring those non-union shops to the table and integrate Local 44 construction crews into the Commercial world. I believe him to be someone who has an expansive amount of knowledge of each of our crafts, the workings of the Union the Executive Board and the ability to represent the Union with professionalism and dignity. 
