Centerline Scenery is their new endeavor that they dove head first into in November of 2016 to focus more on set construction and becoming the one stop shop for any production coming their way. Centerline Scenery is the newest signatory company to join the Local 44 family.

Centerline Scenery is a gorgeous and spacious new facility located in the heart of North Hollywood, and became the stepping stone that launched their name and ability to organize and sign a contract with Local 44. This was a special moment for Josh, he explains elatedly that "my son Myles got his first Local 44 day on this commercial, it was a proud dad moment knowing that he will

have a great future". Centerline's Director of Operations Meredyth Mindte explains that "To Tell The Truth" was their first show they ever

did and they have been going strong ever since opening their doors back in November doing multiple high profile jobs such as; the Grammy's, American Music Awards, Golden Globes, and their current projects are Paris by Night, the Academy of Country Music Awards as well as several game shows and commercials. The Golden Globes were the crowning glory and biggest set they have done so far to date explains Meredyth. Mark and Robert point out that the American Music Awards were the "most creative" set they have built so far, which consisted of a lot of pyrotechnic work in which they took a "bunch of junk they found to make it look like a nuclear explosion" for the popular music group, Fifth Harmony's set. Meredyth describes that event day



as one of the obstacles they have faced so far, "on show day there was a huge rain storm so we had to waterproof everything, using grip tape so the



actors/singers were safe. We were soaked to the bone, we had to jump and run there so our set wasn't ruined" oh the fun of live television! This is an excellent example of Centerline's dedication to customer service.

Mark and Robert both explain that they are a great one stop shop for any production that hires their team. Mark states that, "our ability to handle the design, fabrication, installation, trucking and storage allows Centerline to manage outcomes for our customers that are much more consistent with their expectations." Meredyth and Josh both add that Centerline is able to "build, store, truck, load it in, strike it and our customers do not have to rent anything, we have it all here!" Robert adds that, "we can custom fit
