



We should prepare for another steady pace of work when pilot season and productions return. We will begin to take off by the end of March. This revitalization of California Film and Television employment is the direct result of state lawmakers following our IA California leadership to pass AB1839.

In 2017, the California IATSE Council (CIC) began planning our approach to Legislators in Sacramento to re-up the current California Film Tax Credit. The cover of this issue of Newsreel features the State Capital, which will be a large part of our focus in 2018. It is imperative that California Legislators understand and continue this program.

We launched the "Thank you" campaign on February 14, 2018 giving Lawmakers and their staff information and data showing the success of our

current Film Program and Valentines stating "We love filming in California" & "Keep Filming in California" (pictured on page 7). The objective to this visit was to thank, educate and promote a successor bill extending our current incentive program.

Ed Brown and I repeated to each legislator we met that our Tax Incentives are working and keeping our members at home while productions spend millions of dollars in California supporting good paying middle class careers, ancillary businesses and markets within the state. We will continue to update you on the Film Incentive trek of 2018. Be on the lookout for information from Local 44 on ways you can help the movement.


